

DOWN TO EARTH CSA  
2009 APPLICATION FORM FOR WORKSHARE

Down to Earth CSA Workshare Members will receive a share of organic vegetables each week during the distribution weeks from mid June through November 15 (weather permitting) and a \$375.00 mileage reimbursement in return for working at the Bob White Farm, 5 Michalec Road, Stafford Springs, on weekends and weekdays from April 15 through November 15, 2009, for 8 hours per week.

The time of day Workshare Members will work each week will be agreed upon in advance, but will always include Wednesday afternoon or Saturday morning each week from mid June through October. Two workshare members will work at each harvest, so the day-to-day work of the farm can continue. April and May hours are more flexible

Other work hours will include supervising the farm work teams and farm work days, as the regular members take part in soil preparation, planting, transplanting, weeding, mulching, watering, composting, and other farm related tasks.

The Down to Earth CSA is hoping to find workshare members who have had some experience in growing vegetables organically, but will also consider enthusiastic applicants who have no prior experience.

Everyone who works at the farm must work when someone else is working. No one works alone.

The Workshare staff will be selected, trained, and supervised by Caroline Brown, our CSA Manager.
